New Parenting Materials Available at Local Libraries

There are many wonderful reasons for families to visit the library, such as free access to books, computers, book clubs and story time. A recent grant provides parents one more reason to make the trip.

Each public library in Martin and Pitt County has received a grant to purchase new parenting books, CDs and DVDs for families with young children birth to five years of age. This grant initiative totals \$6500 and is courtesy of Parent Information Resource (PIR), an activity funded by Martin/Pitt Partnership for Children.

Parenting presents unique challenges with endless questions. Materials chosen by individual libraries cover topics about pregnancy, breastfeeding, childbirth, teething, sleeping, development, potty training, discipline, rainy day activities, child care, fatherhood, kindergarten readiness and much more.

Approximately 500 new items have been added to the parenting sections of the following libraries: Sheppard Memorial Library (including Bethel, East, Carver and Winterville branches), Ayden Public Library, Farmville Public Library, Grifton Public Library, Martin Memorial Library and Robersonville Public Library.

Each library has expressed the need for these items and gratitude for the opportunity to update and enhance parenting materials.

ChildLinks will receive a large shipment of books, CDs and DVDs to further increase the materials available for parents. If an item is not available at your local library check with ChildLinks, we may have the item on our shelves!
